The farmer who grows niche produce on one acre and a greenhouse and becomes in demand by national steak houses. The beer maker who starts brewing in a closet and then develops an international following for wild fermentation beer. The salt maker who tested waters in 25 bays before developing a now much-coveted brand from Netarts Bay. Or the oyster harvester who checks on his aquafarm every day, no matter the weather.



And yet these startups – successful as they are as niche products – are without the support of local infrastructure, mentorship, training, workforce support and often, access to capital. They must travel miles away for packaging and canning services, equipment to process their seafood or value-added items, and then deliver by any means possible.
